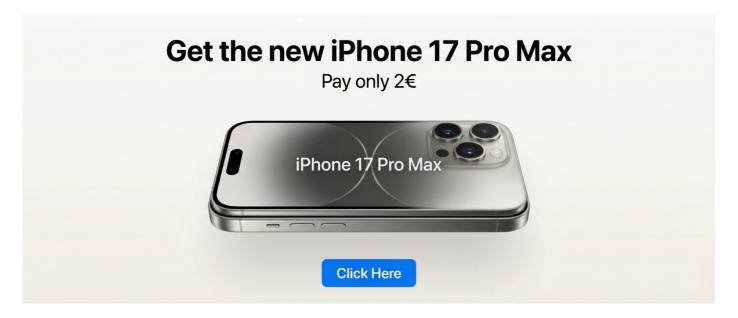

Your choice among these four finishes depends on what you value most — minimalism, personality, practicality, or elegance. Below are some guidelines depending on different user needs:


