Official UK prices: what you pay if buying outright

According to the official listing from Apple UK, the iPhone 17 Pro starts at £1,099. That is the base price for the 256 GB version.

For higher storage capacities, the price increases correspondingly. Third-party retailers indicate that 512 GB and 1 TB variants are available too.

As noted by a UK pricing guide, 256 GB is now the standard base storage for iPhone 17 Pro in the UK — the older 128 GB base model has been dropped.

Therefore, if you want an unlocked, SIM-free iPhone 17 Pro and don't care about monthly payments or carrier deals, expect to pay roughly **£1,099** (256 GB) — and more if you go for 512 GB or 1 TB.

Prices with storage upgrades (approximate ranges)

While Apple does not always publish all storage-tier prices in every region, UK retail data suggests the following approximate price brackets for iPhone 17 Pro:

- 256 GB: ~ £1,099
- 512 GB: higher price (reflecting bigger storage)
- -1 TB: premium price, above 512 GB tier.

These higher-storage options are recommended if you're someone who takes many high-resolution photos or videos, or plans to keep the device for many years with lots of apps and media. Given modern trends — larger apps, 4K video, and heavier photo libraries — 512 GB or even 1 TB might justify the price jump for some users.

Contract and monthly payment plans—cheaper monthly cost, higher total cost

If you don't want to pay the full price at once, UK carriers and retailers offer contract-based deals for iPhone 17 Pro. These spread the cost over months and often bundle data plans or perks.

For example, one common plan offers the iPhone 17 Pro from about **£57.29 per month**, with a small upfront payment and a 36-month contract. That covers a 5 GB data plan under certain providers.

Another provider lists the iPhone 17 Pro under a monthly instalment around **£42.92/month**, with an upfront amount, as part of a combined phone + airtime plan.

These plans can be appealing if you prefer lower monthly outlays instead of a one-time large payment — but over 2–3 years, total cost often ends up higher than buying outright, especially for models with more storage or extra services.

Why base price seems higher this year—and what changed from older models

With the iPhone 17 generation, the manufacturer has shifted to making 256 GB the minimum storage capacity. That means there's no longer a 128 GB "budget" entry version. For buyers, the result is a higher starting price compared to older models that offered a lower-storage base.

In practical terms, that means you're getting more storage out-of-the-box — which matches modern usage patterns (apps, media, photos, video) — but at a higher upfront cost. For many users, that trade-off is acceptable; for those used to 128 GB versions, it feels like a price hike. But especially given how space-hungry modern apps and media are, the higher base storage can be a benefit over the long run.

Should you buy outright or go for a contract plan?

It depends on your priorities:

- You value flexibility and long-term cost efficiency: buying outright (e.g. £1,099 for 256 GB) is often the best bet. You own the device from day one. You're not tied to a carrier or locked into a contract. You avoid interest or long-term commitments.
- You prefer lower monthly payments or don't have large upfront cash: a contract plan could make sense but be aware that total cost over 2–3 years is usually higher. Also, you may end up paying for data and services beyond just the device itself.
- You care about storage space long-term: even though the base 256 GB costs more than previous base-model iPhones, it may save you from needing extra storage (cloud or physical) or from running out of space as apps and files grow.

How to decide: Who should buy iPhone 17 Pro now

Here are a few use cases where buying iPhone 17 Pro in UK makes sense now.

- **Power users:** If you take many photos, shoot video, install many apps, or want a "keep-for-years" phone go for 512 GB or 1 TB outright. The higher storage pays off over time.
- Frequent changers / light users: 256 GB model bought outright gives fast performance, good storage, and avoids monthly bills. Great for average users, social media, daily tasks.
- **Budget-conscious but prefer iPhone:** If you prefer smaller monthly payments, consider a contract but check total cost over the contract period, not just the monthly fee.
